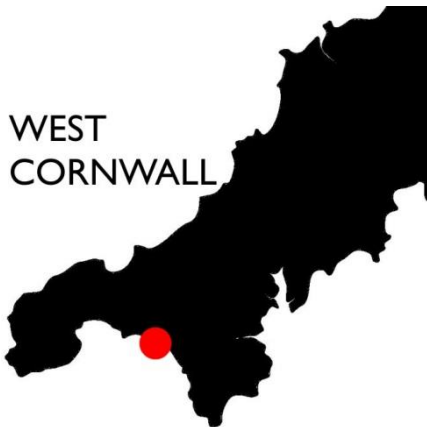


## CP8I Trewavas and Cudden Point



This small project consisted of the restoration and repair of 4 historic stone stiles on the South West Coast Path between Praa Sands and Porthleven in Cornwall. Most of the stone was found adjacent to each stile, but some had to be brought in.

The restored stiles provide a safer and more pleasant crossing of boundaries at each end of two of the Mount's Bay properties, and the excellent stonework

adds an aesthetic value. Walkers are more likely to appreciate the thought and care that is put in to maintaining the paths.

An added benefit is the skilful way that Tim and Chris repaired the Western stile at Trewavas. The robust work facilitates the moving of a small number of ponies from adjacent Rinsey to Trewavas. Grazing is vital to maintain and enhance the heathland and grassland on these pieces of coast and, of course, the presence of the ponies enhances the experience of countless walkers through the site.

The neighbouring farmer is pleased to see that the Trewavas East stile is now more stock-proof – occasional escapes by his cattle are now easier to contain on his own land.
